### Mapping of bi-regional cooperation on biodiversity and climate change research

- **First Step (January – March 2014)**
  - Bibliometric analysis performed with WoS
  - Results presented during Santa Mara workshop (March 2014)
  - List of recommendations for future developments
- **Second Step (September – December 2014)**
  - In collaboration with BiodivERsA
  - Bibliometric and BiodivERsA database analysis
  - Results presented in Marseille (today!)
  - Questionnaire to ALCUE NET partners and PIs

## 1) Progress achieved this year / Scientific area

### List of common priority topics and issues identified during Santa Marta workshop (see supporting document provided in Marseille)

1. Biodiversity assessment and monitoring – Improving baseline distribution data and compatibility with climate datasets
2. Observatories network – Alignment of existing infrastructures and information platforms
3. Ecosystem-based adaptation and resilience

- Collaboration with other initiatives
  - CORDEX (workshop on biodiversity and climate change, Bogota May/June 2015)
  - BiodivERsA (mapping)
  - CIBIO (public private partnerships / twin labs)
  - ERA NET LAC (list of topics improved and used for a first joint call)
  - FRB (workshop in Marseille / CESAB)
  - Side events COP 20 in Lima, COP 21 in Paris



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## 1) Progress achieved this year / Technical area

- **Organisation of workshops**
  - Santa Marta, Colombia, 4-6 March 2014
  - Marseille, France, 26-28 November 2014
  - Lima (Side event COP 20), 4 December 2014
- **Structuring of cooperation with a sustainable network of experts (to be further implemented in 2015)**
  - 15 experts who participated in Santa Marta workshop
  - Various types of thematic groups:
    - Call opportunities (Horizon 2020, ERA Net, Future Earth...)
    - Public / Private partnerships
    - Latitudinal and altitudinal patterns of biodiversity and their relevance to resilience vis a vis climate change
    - Specific events (ALCUE NET/CORDEX workshop...)
